Montana now has 118 victories since the start of the 2000 season and will finish the decade with the most wins of any FBS or FCS Div. I team. Appalachian State is the closest pursuer at the FCS level with 101 victories.

Playoff Extra Points

- UM is averaging a playoff-best 56 points game.

- UM has scored on 15 of 16 playoff red zone possessions.
- UM is **+9** in turnovers in the playoffs. App State is **-1**.
- Marc Mariani has 18 catches for 282 yards and three receiving TD in the playoffs.
- Chase Reynolds has scored 5 TDs, most in the playoffs.
- Andrew Selle has six playoff TD passes, most of all the playoff QBs.



Griz on TV

Grizzly football games have been on TV 66 straight games (the Appy State game will be 67 straight). The last game not broadcast (purposely) was the Ft Lewis game at which the 1995 team was present (they wanted to make sure it was a sellout). Before that game, the Griz games had a streak of 99 games on TV in a row. So, with the Appy State game, 166 of the last 167 Griz games have been broadcast (99.49%).

- 163 Consecutive weeks ranked in the Sports Network top 25, dating back to the 1998 season.
- 2,801 Career receiving yards by Marc Mariani, tops in school history
- 37.8 Average points per game scored by Montana this season, most in FCS
- 91 Consecutive points scored by Montana over the last 80 minutes and 25 seconds of the playoffs
- 1-0 Montana's all-time record vs. Appalachian State
