Sac State was tabbed seventh in both of the 2007 preseason polls (above).

GRIZ BY THE NUMBERS

3rd-In the nation are the Griz in scoring defense, allowing 12.8 points a game (64 so far this season).

5-0-Start for the Griz in 2007. The last time Montana started the season at 5-0 was in 2002, and that is no easy task, as the Griz have done that only four times since 1989.

4-5-Now in career sacks and tackles for losses is Griz senior D-end Kroy Biermann, with 24 and 36.5 respectively.

7th-Now in career tackles is senior linebacker Tyler Joyce, with 287 stops. He's tied with former safety Todd Ericson.

10-Big Sky Conference wins in a row now for Montana, which was 8-0 in league play last season.

12-0-Are the Griz against the Hornets since the teams first met (a 54-7 UM home win in '93). UM had close calls twice in Missoula, winning 41-38 in two OTs in 1999 and 24-20 in 2000 on a last-second play.

16-of 17 field goals over the last two seasons for Carpenter, who is 8-of-9 this year.

17-Of their last 18 games have the Griz been victorious, going back to last season.

27-3-Now are the Griz in the 29 times that they've been ranked No. 1 in the country.

34-Career starts in a row for senior offensive tackle Cody Balogh.

48-More points scored by the Grizzlies in the second half than their four opponents this season (83 to 35).

46-Career victories for Coach Hauck -- which ties him for the third most in school history with Doug Fessenden who won 46 in 10 seasons.

127-Consecutive weeks now that UM has been ranked in *The Sports Network's* top 25.

THE LAST TIME UM WAS #1: The last time the Grizzlies were ranked No. 1 was in 2004 prior to their third game of the season at Sam Houston State, which was a 41-29 Griz loss.

MISSOULA – Junior quarterback Cole Bergquist threw two touchdown passes to senior wide receiver Eric Allen, senior halfback Lex Hilliard rushed for 108 yards and a touchdown, and senior kicker Dan Carpenter made three-of-three field goal attempts as the second-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies (1-0) defeated the visiting Southern Utah Thunderbirds in the 2007 season opener for both teams.

There were 23,599 fans in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium, which is the 10th largest attendance here in 153 games. It was also an all-time attendance high for a home opener, surpassing the crowd of 23,454 at last year's home opener against South Dakota State.

The final score was not indicative of the game.

The pesky Thunderbirds (0-1) of the Great West Conference cut the Grizzly lead to 14-9 with 7:30 to go in the third quarter, when senior halfback Johnny Sanchez scored on a 1-yard run.

Montana, of the Big Sky Conference, answered the Sanchez score with a 42-yard field goal by Carpenter to take a 17-9 advantage with 2:19 left in the third stanza.

Carpenter tacked on another field goal early in the fourth quarter, this one a 41-yarder, and Bergquist gave the Grizzlies some breathing room when he scampered up the middle for a 14-yard touchdown run – the first scoring run of his career. Bergquist's TD run made it 27-9 Montana with 9:21 to go.

Southern Utah battled back, though, with Sanchez plowing over for another 1-yard touchdown, and then talented Thunderbird senior quarterback Wes Marshall hit senior wide receiver Jeremy Edwards for a two-point conversion, and cut the Griz lead to 27-17 with 5:14 remaining.

Montana put the game out of reach with 3:16 left when Bergquist hit Allen on a 29-yard scoring pass. Carpenter added three more points on a 41-yard field goal with 1:49 to go for the final points of the game.

Bergquist, who improved to 7-3 as a starter, completed 15-of-22 passes for 150 yards and a pair of touchdowns without an interception, and gained 26 yards rushing on five carries.

Hilliard, who missed last season with an injury, broke the century mark for the 12th time in his career and gained 108 yards on 22 carries.

Both of Allen's catches went for touchdowns. UM senior Ryan Bagley added 3 catches for 25 yards, while senior halfback Reggie Bradshaw also had 3 receptions.

Carpenter, who led the FCS in field goals last season with 1.71 a game, was perfect on all three attempts, one from 42 yards out, and two 41-yarders.

UM senior punter Tyson Johnson, who also missed last season with an injury, had three punts for a 46.0-yard average, including a 56-yarder.

The Griz defense was led by senior end Kroy Biermann and senior linebacker Tyler Joyce, each with 6 tackles, while junior safety Colt Anderson had 4 tackles, a stop for a loss, and a key interception in the Southern Utah end zone. Senior linebacker Loren Utterback and sophomore safety Shann Schillinger also had picks for UM.

Marshall was 19-of-32-3 for 218 yards, rushed for a team-high 65 yards on 13 carries, and was sacked just once. Sanchez had 11 rushes for 28 yards and two scores.

SUU junior receiver Craig Gritton had 6 grabs for a game-high 116 yards, while junior slotback Nick Miller had 6 catches for 55 yards.

The Thunderbird's defensive leaders were senior cornerback Derrick Brown with 12 tackles, while sophomore linebacker Robert Takeno had 10 stops and 2 tackles for losses.

MONTANA 49, FORT LEWIS 0

MISSOULA, MT – The third-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies scored on their first three possessions – all three times on running plays by senior halfback Lex Hilliard, en route to the win over the Fort Lewis College Skyhawks.

The Griz, who played 73 players in the game, wasted no time, as Hilliard took just 11 seconds to score when he broke up the middle for a 54-yard TD jaunt on Montana's opening drive.

Fort Lewis (0-1), playing its season opener, went three-and-out on its first series, and the Griz culminated a five-play, 40-yard scoring drive, on a 5-yard TD by Hilliard.

The Skyhawks managed a first down on their second series, but were thwarted on a 4th-and-one from the Griz 43 when FLC QB Tom Stoffel fumbled and UM senior linebacker Kyle Ryan recovered the ball.

After Ryan's fumble recovery Montana marched 57 yards on nine plays, Hilliard scoring from two yards out. A 24-yard pass from junior quarterback Cole Bergquist to sophomore h-back Kevin Klabeo and four runs for 16 yards by Hilliard accounted for all of the offense in that scoring drive.

Bergquist was 4-of-4 for 37 yards on the next drive, and it was capped off when junior halfback Greg Coleman tallied his first career TD on a 9-yard run, giving UM a 28-0 cushion with 7:47 to go until half.

The Griz jumped ahead by a 35-0 margin right before intermission when Bergquist hooked up with senior wide receiver Ryan Bagley for a 15-yard score with 26 seconds remaining until halftime.

The Grizzlies dominated the final two quarters, as they out-gained the Skyhawks 256 yards to 22 in the second half. UM passed 12 times for 126 yards and rushed 35 times for 130 yards in the final two quarters, while Fort Lewis ran 19 plays for 22 yards (they had 2 yards passing) and had two first downs in the final 30 minutes of the game.

UM tacked on two more scores in the last half, when senior halfback Reggie Bradshaw scored on a 6-yard run, and then sophomore halfback Thomas Brooks-Fletcher broke loose for a 21-yard scoring run with 13:06 left in the game, giving the Griz 49-0 lead.

The Griz out-gained the Division II Skyhawks 512 total yards to 136.

Hilliard had 86 yards and the three TDs.

The Griz played all four of their quarterbacks who are on the active roster. Bergquist was 13-of-13 for 163 yards and a TD; redshirt freshman Andrew Selle was 6-of-9-0 for 80 yards; "true" freshman Jeff Larson completed 1-of-2 for 12 yards; and sophomore Clint Stapp did not have a pass attempt.

Ten different Griz players also had at least one catch, led by Bagley who had 3 catches for 59 yards. He was followed by sophomore Marc Mariani with 3 receptions for 50 yards; junior Mike Ferriter had 3 for 43; and sophomore Tyler Palmer, who had his first career catch in the win, added 3 for 21. Mariani also had 4 punt returns for 74 yards.

UM's leader on "D" was junior LB Tyler Corwin with 8 stops. Senior end Kroy Biermann added 5 tackles, along with 1.5 stops for losses and a sack. Severin Campbell, a redshirt freshman linebacker, and senior linebacker Tyler Joyce each also had 7 tackles.

MISSOULA - Junior quarterback Cole Bergquist passed for two scores and ran for another two, and senior halfback Lex Hilliard rushed for two touchdowns as the host and second-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies defeated the University at Albany Great Danes.

A crowd of 23,097, the 24th largest in 155 games played at Washington-Grizzly Stadium, saw Bergquist shatter his previous high in rushing yards with 89 on just nine carries. His previous high was 25 yards against McNeese State in a first-round Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA) playoff game in Missoula last season.

Bergquist was 21-of-32-1 for a career-high 282 yards and two touchdowns. His previous high in passing yards was 257 against South Dakota State in his only start of last season.

Hilliard rushed 21 times for 136 yards, hitting the century mark for the 13th time in his career and the second time this season.

The Grizzlies (3-0) took a 7-0 lead on their third possession of the game at the 4:45 mark of the first quarter when Bergquist connected with senior receiver Ryan Bagley on a 12-yard scoring pass.

UAlbany tied the contest at 7-all with 8:14 to go in the opening half when senior tailback Omar Johnson scored on a 1-yard run on a fourth-and-goal situation.

Montana regained the lead (14-7) for good with 1:49 left until intermission on a 1-yard run by Hilliard. The Griz got excellent field position to start that drive thanks to a 17-yard punt return by sophomore Marc Mariani, who advanced the ball to the UAlbany 37-yard line.

Bergquist's 55-yard touchdown run with 10:03 left in the third stanza gave UM a 21-7 advantage.

Montana took a three-touchdown lead at 28-7 with 9:56 to go in the contest, as Hilliard had his sixth rushing touchdown of the season.

The Great Danes battled back, though, as sophomore quarterback Vinny Esposito hit sophomore split end Jason Smith for a 23-yard touchdown pass with 6:43 remaining, making it 28-14 UM. Ualbanay then recovered the ensuing on-side kick and advanced the ball to Montana's 24-yard line, but an Esposito pass was picked off by UM freshman cornerback Jeremy Pate to thwart the Great Danes' comeback bid.

UM put the game on ice on their last possession, as Bergquist hit senior wide receiver Eric Allen for a 30-yard TD pass, making it 35-14.

UM's leading rushers were Hilliard's 136 yards, while Bergquist racked up 89 yards, and freshman quarterback Jeff Larson had seven totes for 34 yards. Senior halfback Reggie Bradshaw was injured on a kickoff return in the second quarter and did not have a carry.

Junior receiver Mike Ferriter led the Griz with game-highs of 7 catches for 84 yards; Allen had 4 for 85 and a score; Bagley had 4 for 38 and a TD; and Hilliard added 2 for 35.

Griz senior LB Tyler Joyce had a team-high 10 tackles and a forced fumble, while senior end Kroy Biermann had 7 tackles, two sacks, and a forced fumble. Junior safety Colt Anderson also had 7 tackles, while soph end Jace Palmer added 2 sacks.

MONTANA 18, WEBER STATE 10

MISSOULA, MT – The No.1-ranked Montana's defense shut out visiting Weber State Wildcats in the second half and rebounded for the Big Sky Conference victory in their annual Homecoming game in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium/John Hoyt Field.

It was the Grizzlies 15th straight Homecoming win. On its second possession WSU (0-4, 0-2 Big Sky) marched 94 yards on a 14-play drive to take a 7-0 lead, as senior halfback Adrian Conway hit tight end B.A. Harrell for a 10-yard TD pass. It was Harrell's first catch of the season and Conway's first career TD pass. It is also the first time that Montana has trailed in a game this season.

The Wildcats took a 10-0 lead when junior kicker Conor Foley connected on a 30-yard field goal at the 14:54 mark in the third period. The field goal was set up when Griz quarterback Cole Bergquist fumbled the ball when he was sacked and linebacker J.D. Folsom recovered the fumble on the UM 24-yard line.

In its first series after the WSU field goal, UM finally got on the scoreboard, as senior kicker Dan Carpenter connected on the first of four field goal attempts, this one from 47 yards out, making it 10-3 WSU at intermission.

The Grizzlies (4-0, 1-0) cut the Wildcat lead 10-6 with 13:35 to go in the third stanza, with Carpenter booting a 40-yard field goal. UM had the ball on the Weber State 25-yard line after a 62-yard kickoff return by sophomore Marc Mariani on the opening play of the second half but had to settle for Carpenter's three-pointer.

Montana once again mounted a solid drive on its next series, moving the ball to the Wildcat 14-yard line, but once again came away with three points on a Carpenter field goal, this one a 29-yarder, making it 10-9 WSU with 5:25 remaining in the third quarter.

The Griz got excellent field position again on their next possession, thanks to an interception by UM senior linebacker Kyle Ryan. Starting from the WSU 25-yard line this time, Montana scored its only touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run by junior halfback Greg Coleman. UM employed five straight rushing plays by four different players in the drive leading to the Coleman TD.

Carpenter, who had made 21 consecutive PATs going back to the Northern Colorado game last season, missed the PAT attempt after Coleman's score, and that miss would help to keep the Wildcats within striking distance.

Carpenter's fourth field goal came with 6:35 to go in the game, on a 17-play, 73-yard drive that took almost six minutes, this time he kicked one from 24 yards out, giving the Griz an 18-10 lead.

WSU, down only a TD and a two-point conversion, had a first-and-10 from the Griz 22-yard line, but three penalties, three incompletions by redshirt freshman quarterback Cameron Higgins, and a sack by UM's Kroy Biermann pushed the ball all the way back to the Wildcats' 37-yard line, which placed them in a fourth-and-51 situation.

Bergquist was 17-of-30-1 for 186 yards and rushed 10 times for 39 yards. Coleman had 16 totes for 39 yards and a TD. UM senior halfback Lex Hilliard had 11 carries for 27 yards and left the game with an injury mid-way through the third quarter. Junior receiver Mike Ferriter led the Griz with 5 catches for 43 yards, while senior Ryan Bagley added 3 for 33.

UM's defense was led by junior safety Colt Anderson's game-high 10 tackles, while Biermann had eight stops and two sacks, and senior linebacker Loren Utterback had 10 tackles and two stops for losses.

Montana's defense held the Wildcats to 242 yards, including just 78 yards and six first downs in the second half.

The game was marred by penalties, as UM had 11 for 120 yards, while WSU had 13 for 120.

MISSOULA, MT – Senior kicker Dan Carpenter connected on a 34-yard field goal with 26 seconds remaining, as the top-ranked Griz edged the visiting EWU Eagles in a key Big Sky Conference game in front of 23,226 fans at UM’s Washington-Grizzly Stadium/John Hoyt Field.

The hard-fought victory kept the Grizzlies undefeated at 5-0 overall and 2-0 in conference, while the Eagles are now 3-2 and 1-2.

The Eagles took a 23-21 lead with 2:20 left in the game on a 39-yard field goal by junior kicker Felipe Macias. The go-ahead three-pointer by Macias was made possible when Montana was called for a “roughing the snapper” penalty. It appeared as though UM would get the ball back after holding EWU, but the 15-yard penalty gave them new life and a first down on the UM 43-yard line. EWU then advanced the ball to the Griz 23-yard line to set up the go-ahead field goal.

Montana jumped to a 14-0 lead in the opening half on two scoring passes by junior quarterback Cole Bergquist, the first a 26-yarder to senior Ryan Bagley and the second was a 20-yarder to junior Mike Ferriter, giving the Grizzlies a 14-0 lead.

The Eagles came right back, scoring twice before intermission. The first EWU score came when sophomore quarterback Matt Nichols hit sophomore Brynsen Brown for a 21-yard touchdown pass, and then Macias added a 32-yard field goal, making it 14-10, UM, at the half.

EWU took its first lead (17-14) of the game in the third quarter, as Nichols threw a 37-yard touchdown pass to Aaron Boyce. They scored again on their next possession, Macias kicking a 42-yard field goal to put his team ahead 20-14.

Montana came right back though, as senior halfback Lex Hilliard powered his way in on a 1-yard touchdown run. Carpenter’s PAT made it 21-20 Grizzlies with 6:17 remaining in the third quarter.

In EWU’s third series in the last quarter they scored on a Macias’ field goal with 2:20 to go, and that looked like it might be the game-winner.

Facing a 4th-and-10 from their own 38, Bergquist lofted a pass to Bagley who made a diving catch in front of the EWU bench, and Montana had a first down at the Eagles’ 35-yard line. A couple of Bergquist passes to junior receiver Mike Ferriter covering 18 yards moved the ball to the EWU 17-yard line to set up Carpenter’s game-winner.

Bergquist was 16-of-32-0 for 181 yards and two TDs, and rushed 10 times for 38 yards. Ferriter had a team-high of 6 catches for 65 yards and scored his first touchdown of the season. Bagley had 2 grabs for 53 yards and a score.

Hilliard had game-highs of 15 carries for 70 yards and scored his seventh rushing touchdown of the season, and he also had 3 receptions.

Senior LBs Tyler Joyce and Loren Utterback led the Griz with 12 tackles each.
